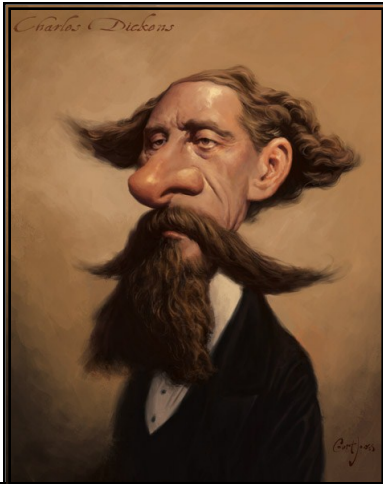

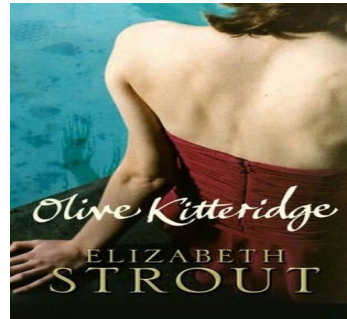

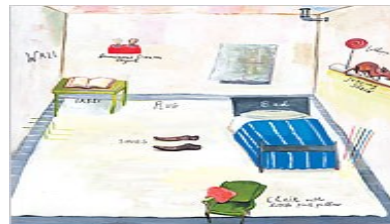


The unforgettable Olive Kitterage takes center stage in this collection of 13 stories by Pulitzer Prize winning author Elizabeth Strout.

By Emma Donoghue



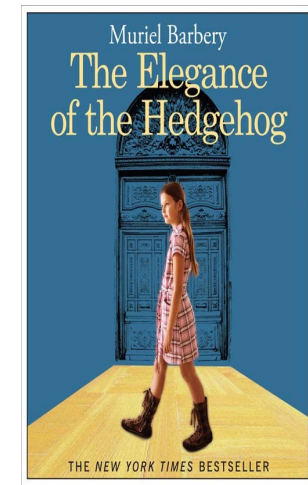
Five-year old Jack and his mother must eat, sleep and play inside a one room prison
